### **REPORT:**

Under Section 167 of the Municipal Act (R.S.O. 1990) and Ontario Regulation 438-97, the Treasurer is required to prepare and submit an annual investment report containing the following information:

- 1. a statement about the performance of the portfolio of investments of the municipality during the period covered by the report;
- 2. a description of the estimated proportion of the total investment of a municipality that are invested in its own long-term and short-term securities to the total investment of the municipality and a description of the change, if any, in that estimated proportion since the previous year's report;
- 3. a statement by the treasurer as to whether or not, in his of her opinion, all investments were made in accordance with the investment policies and goals adopted by the municipality;
- 4. a record of the date of each transaction in or disposal of its own securities, including a statement of the purchase and sale price of each security; and
- 5. such other information that the council may require or that, in the opinion of the treasurer, should be included.

Investments consists of Government of Canada treasury bills, bonds, high grade provincial treasury bills or bond, and various short term instruments offered by the five major chartered banks. All investments are made in accordance with the parameters set out in the Municipal Act and in accordance with the City's investment policies and goals. The distribution of the investment portfolio as at December 31, 1999 are as follows: 12% with the Federal Government and its agencies, 68% with provincial governments and their agencies, 10% with municipal governments, and 10% with other institutions, primarily the five major chartered banks.

Gross investment and interest income for 1999 totalled \$4.3 million, a decrease of \$0.7 million from the 1998 earnings caused mainly by the delays in the 1999 interim and final tax billings. The average rate of return on pooled investments for 1999 amounted to 8.28% which is an increase of 63 basis points over 1998's rate because of a shift in the average portfolio mix from a historical 50/50 split between short and long term instruments to a more predominate weighting of longer term instruments.

Appendices attached to this report are described below:

Appendix A provides for a detailed listing of the investment portfolio as at December 31, 1999. All investments listed were made in accordance with the City's investment policies and goals.

Appendix B provides for a detailed listing of medium and long term investments purchased and redeemed during the 1999 year. For each transaction, it shows the date of the investment, the maturity date, the price paid, the yield and redemption value. All transactions were made in accordance with the City's investment policies and goals.

Appendix C provides for a Statement of the Treasurer, as required under Section 167 of the Municipal Act (R.S.O. 1990) and Ontario Regulation 438/97 made under the Municipal Act.
