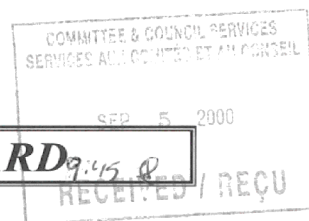

This painting hangs in a prominent location on the second floor of the RMOC building on Lisgar Street. The name of each winner is inscribed on a plaque beneath the painting and the winner also receives a mounted print of the painting.

This is the Call of Nominations for the 2000 award. The presentation will be made on November 09, at the volunteer recognition night for the Ottawa-Carleton Chapter of the Multiple Sclerosis Society. Please bring this award to the attention of your Board of Directors. **The deadline for nominations is October 09.** Nominees must be disabled persons who have made achievements in Ottawa-Carleton in **one or more** of the fields of accessible transport, barrier-free access, and living independently within the community. The ideal candidate will have made an outstanding contribution over a considerable period of time, or will have broken new ground and, **especially, will possess some of Peggy Allan's qualities** as a pioneer and role model. In preparing your submission, please note that supporting documentation from other sources will be welcomed.

This is a prestigious award, to be bestowed on the most deserving disabled volunteers in our community. Most of the candidates for this award will have already received recognition from various organizations within the community.

_____**THE PEGGY ALLAN
MEMORIAL AWARD**

Peggy Allan (1913-1996) lived with multiple sclerosis for almost 40 years. She never perceived herself as a person with a disability, but quietly decided that her physical limitations would not deter her from leading a full and useful life.

Inspiration

Peggy Allan inspired and pioneered the changes needed to integrate persons with disabilities. In the early 1970's, she helped to initiate a parallel transportation service in Ottawa-Carleton, now called Para-Transpo. For more than 25 years, she served on local, provincial and national committees and organizations to improve transportation services, enhance accessibility and allow persons with disabilities to live independently.

Leadership

Whether Peggy Allan worked alone, or lobbied with others, her leadership, spirit and style won people over to the cause without confrontation. People wanted to work with her because of her intelligence, grace and charm. Her commitment, good sense and persistence ensured results.

The Peggy Allan Memorial Award was established to honour her memory and recognize individuals who continue her work.

PURPOSE OF THE AWARD

To acknowledge and recognize a person with a physical and/or sensory disability who has worked co-operatively to benefit persons with disabilities in Ottawa-Carleton in the areas of accessible transportation, barrier-free access and living independently.

SELECTION CRITERIA

The successful nominee will:

- Be a person with a physical and/or sensory disability.
- Have worked and achieved results in one of the following areas:
 - Accessible transportation.
 - Barrier-free access.
 - Living independently.
- Possess one or more of the following characteristics:
 - Vision and initiative;
 - Ability to inspire others with the importance of their common goals;
 - Demonstrates respect for the opinions of others and for people in different situations;
 - Not a previous recipient of the award.

Subject / Objet: Joint Event by ACED and DIAC

At its meeting of September 11, 2000, the Advisory Committee on Equity and Diversity (ACED) met with Barry McMahon of the Disability Issues Advisory Committee (DIAC). The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the possibilities for a joint venture, as approved in principle in earlier meetings of each advisory committee. The following represents a summary of the discussion, which ACED would like to submit to DIAC as a proposal for the framework for the event.

It was proposed that a Round Table symposium be held on December 8, 2000 from 10:00 until 12:00 noon at Ottawa City Hall (preferably in Victoria Hall, but this is subject to confirmation). The broad theme of the discussion will be ***"Diversity, Access, and Disability: A Round Table on Human Rights in the New Ottawa"***. Following the event itself, the

commentary will be summarized in a report, which the advisory committees will jointly submit to the new City Council for their consideration in January 2001.

The format would be as follows: a prominent person will be invited to serve as moderator - perhaps former Mayor Jacquelin Holzman, or Norman Cooke of CIDA could be approached. A series of guests would be invited to deliver brief commentaries (10 minute maximum) on the issues facing the new City, with a clear focus on a linkage to ethnocultural issues and disability.

While specific guests will be invited to speak, others will be invited as observers, who will have the opportunity to comment or ask questions as part of the structure. Similarly, as part of the strategy is to bring attention to the issues to the political level, the new City Council, which will by then have been elected, will be invited to attend as well. The media will be invited to report on the event.

As part of the brain-storming session, Barry of DIAC and ACED members came up with this plan for people/groups to invite, and specific areas of discussion which we could suggest for them:

Abebe Engdasaw, Multicultural Health Coalition:	Disability issues and health from a multicultural perspective
Canadian Ethnocultural Council:	Discussion of a recent paper tabled on the issues of ethnocultural issues surrounding the use of prescription drugs
Odawa Native Friendship Centre:	Aboriginal perspectives on disability issues
The Royal Bank:	An employer's perspective on disability in the workplace
DPCR:	Access issues to social services for people with a disability
Marva Major, O-C District School Board:	Disability issues in the education system

Other issues or organizations discussed which might be canvassed/represented by groups or people to be invited included: gender issues and disability, HIV/AIDS issues from a cross-cultural perspective; REACH; Independent Living Centres; Elizabeth Hung-Sorfleet (former Chair of ACED, and past Commissioner with the Ontario Human Rights Commission).

The Committee also discussed the financial aspects of the event, such as food/refreshments, transportation, sign language interpretation and printing costs. After discussion, the Committee approved the following motion:

“That ACED and DIAC share the expenses of the December 8th event of up to a total of \$1,500.00.”

Before this event can proceed as outlined above, it would be appropriate for your Committee to approve a similar motion.

We look forward to working with you.
