Dear Mr. Premier:

On behalf of the Accessibility sub-committee we would like to express our concern about the anticipated changes to the funding of discretionary benefits under supplementary aid and special assistance.

The Accessibility committee is a subcommittee of Regional Coordinating Committee to End Violence Against Women, a coalition of more than 50 agencies and individuals working towards ending women abuse. Our committee's mandate is to enhance the understanding of the realities of women with disabilities and to help service agencies address accessibility issues so that resources and services can respond appropriately to all women.

Items such as wheelchair repairs, ostomy supplies or bathroom aids are vital to the well-being, safety, and independence of people with disabilities. While such items are obvious, the province cannot ignore other supports provided under supplementary aid / special assistance. For a woman with a disability living with violence, access to items such as these which are essential for her mobility, well-being, safety and independence may be absolutely crucial to her ability to leave a situation

We have been proud that Ottawa-Carleton has been enlightened enough to assist with these items in the past. We feel it would be very short sighted to cease to provide the necessary supports to independence and safety. The province has a responsibility to ensure that the terms of cost sharing do not put municipalities into a position of having to sacrifice these essential benefits.

We want to hear clearly how you intend to protect these benefits for citizens of Ontario who need assistance in order to live independent lives. We look forward to your response as soon as possible.
